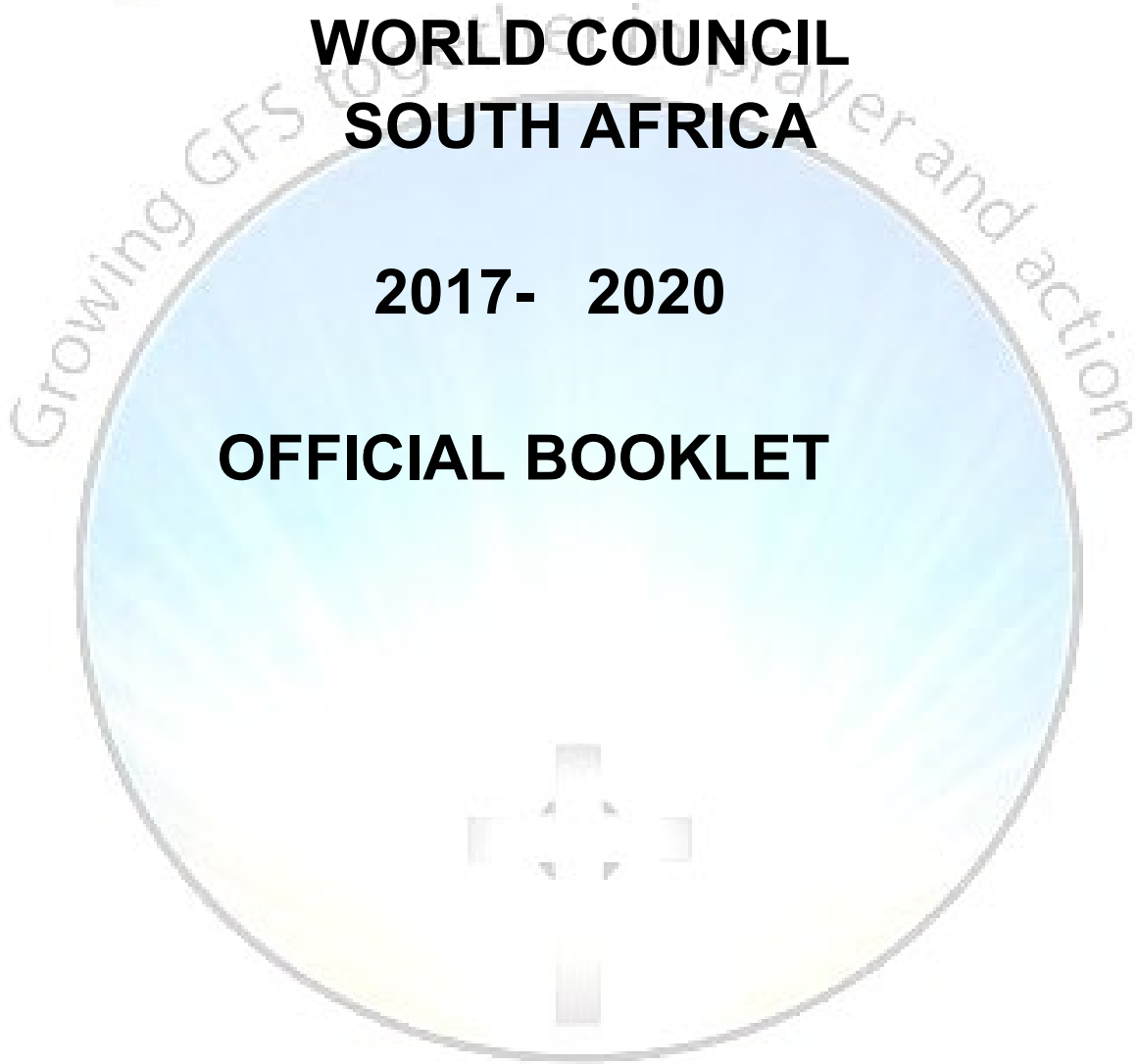

1. Orange Day was taken up in various forms throughout the country,

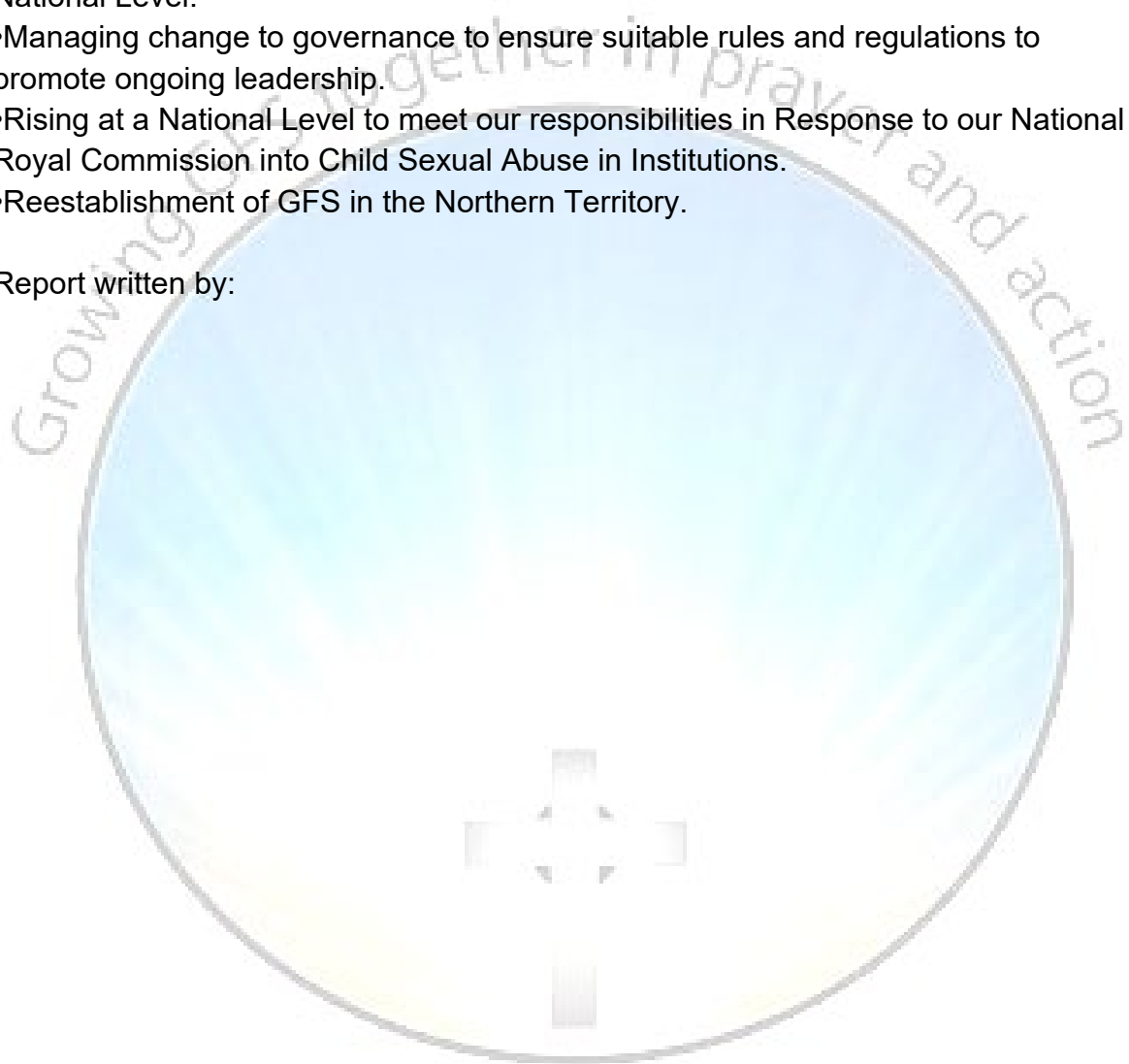

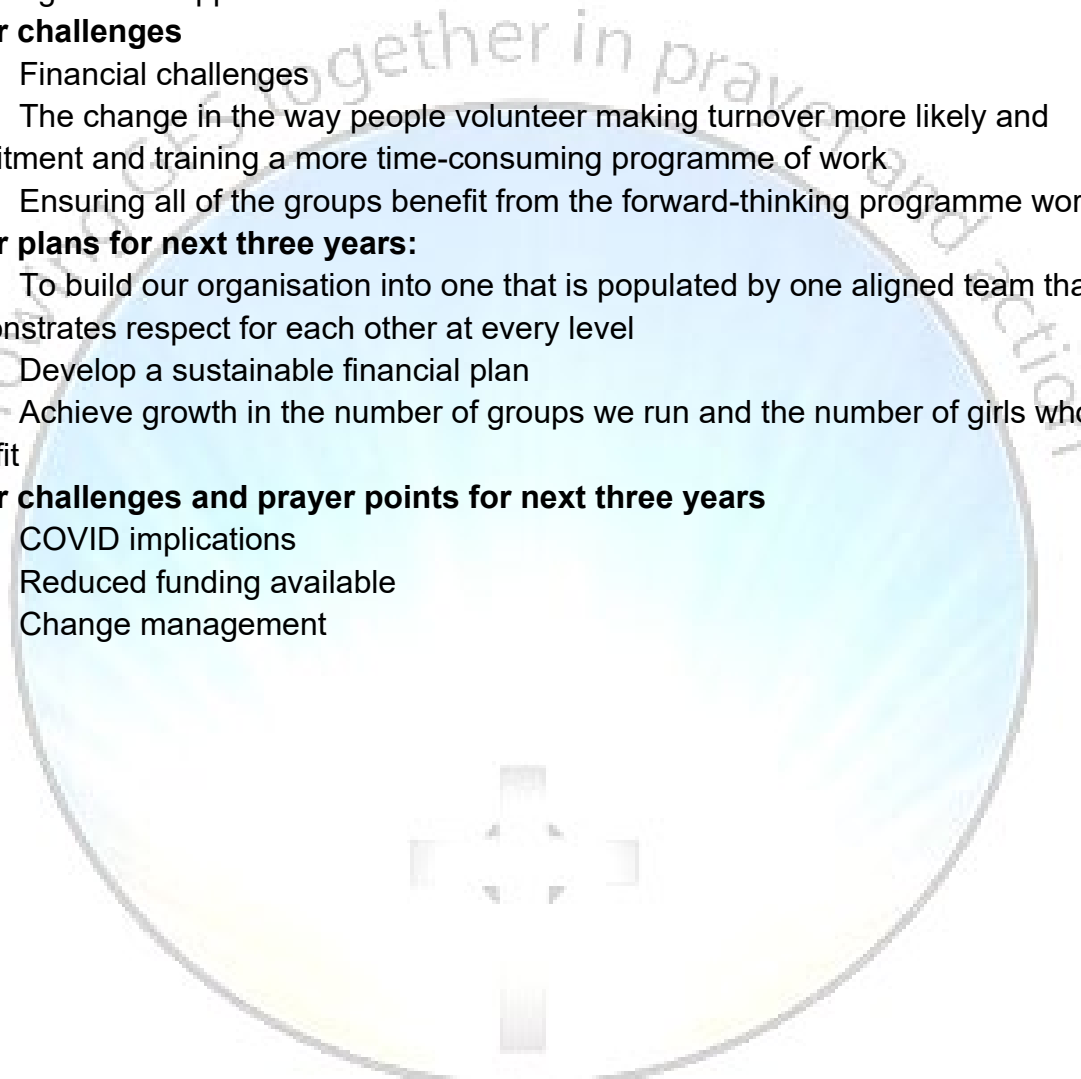

GIRL FRIENDLY SOCIETY ESWATINI REPORT.

1. The working GFS committee was commissioned the 15th of February 2020. The reverend Thandekile Zulu chairs the committee.
2. The first meeting was held on 14/03/2020.
3. The committee was given a mandate to teach and empower children at a tender age.
4. The targeted children are Sunday school to junior youth.

PILOT PARISHES: Three parishes were identified for piloting before it is rolled out to the entire parish. That is Ezulwini parish, St Michaels and St Georges and James parish.

MEETINGS

The national lockdown was announced soon after our first physical meeting. There after all our monthly meetings were held virtually. On the 24th of June we held a local workshop, where MRS Mashwama took us other stages they went through when they were starting St Agnes in the Diocese. This was necessary for us as it opened our eyes to all the steps to follow and armed us to face opposition. In the meeting of 25/08/20, we started crafting local objectives which were later presented to the bishop. In December we started reaching out to the parishes. On the thirteenth Ezulwini parish was visited. The vision was shared with the council and the entire congregation and was accepted.

OBJECTIVES

1. To foster Christian principles and values in the lives of boys and girls.
2. To tackle issues of inequality and gender based violence our communities.
3. To build self-esteem and self-worth in boys and girls.
4. To enhance leadership qualities for continued growth.
5. To impart life skills for personal and community growth.
6. To foster active participation in church and community activities.

THE ABOVE WILL BE ARCHIEVED BY:

- Skills assessment and identifying and identifying the needs for development.
- Education and information workshops, seminars and talks.
- Resource mobilization.
- Identifying mentors and role models secure age members.
- Providing practical and diverse learning opportunities for the development of members.
- Advocating for the organization so that it gets to be known across the Diocese.

Major highlights and joys:

- *In our country, cases of Covid 19 have increased a lot, and vaccines have been beginning to do so this June with people aged 60 and over.*
- *Neither the government nor the parents have authorized meetings with children and young people due to the severity of the pandemic. - We have not been able to meet to make a video clip due to these circumstances. I am so sorry*
- *At the end of 2020 they had 2 hurricanes that left many victims in shelters, pain, deaths, mourning, material loss, damaged or totally destroyed homes, mainly in the northern region, Copan and Yuscaran.*
- *We met with some adult GFS coordinators and three of our youth to prepare food and take them to the shelters.*
- *Collection of clothes, groceries, medicines to take to the shelters.*
- *I attach photos at our 2020 meeting in February.*
- *In the month of September 2020 we joined in the prayer service held by the GFS of the USA, only a few of our young women were able to participate since not all of them had a good reception on their phones.*
- *Through WhatsApp we send messages of hope, biblical reading and reflections to our GFS thus keeping us in contact.*

- *In the next month of August 2021 we will begin with an Alpha Biblical course where they will learn a greater knowledge about Jesus Christ, we believe that it is important to keep the flame burning in their hearts since none of them can attend their churches for the reasons indicated above.*

Major challenges and prayer points for next three years:

- *Meet again in person to carry out joint activities that help our girls and young people to grow spiritually.*
- *Help others by being better neighbors.*
- *Carry out activities that contribute to the care of creation and climate change.*
- *Continue promoting in other GFS congregations and be able to create other branch (es).*
- *We ask for your prayers for our diocese, our country, and our girls and young women.*

Both the hurricanes and the Covid 19 pandemic have led to job losses, we were confined from March to September 2020, even several companies are working with the teleworking modality, the above has impacted the most needy and vulnerable, including the majority of families. of our girls, that is why it is also difficult for us to reach all of them via zoom, each coordinator in one way or another tries to send them reflections that encourage them to always maintain their trust in God.

- *In the midst of this panorama that is not very encouraging, we are very grateful to our Lord because his mercy has saved us from all evil, from all pandemics, because his hand has always been caring for us and blessing us, as Corinthians 2 Corinthians 4: 8-9 says: "Thus, although full of problems, we are not without a way out; we have worries, but we do not despair. They persecute us, but we are not abandoned; they tear us down, but they do not destroy us."*

Our mighty and loving God is with us.

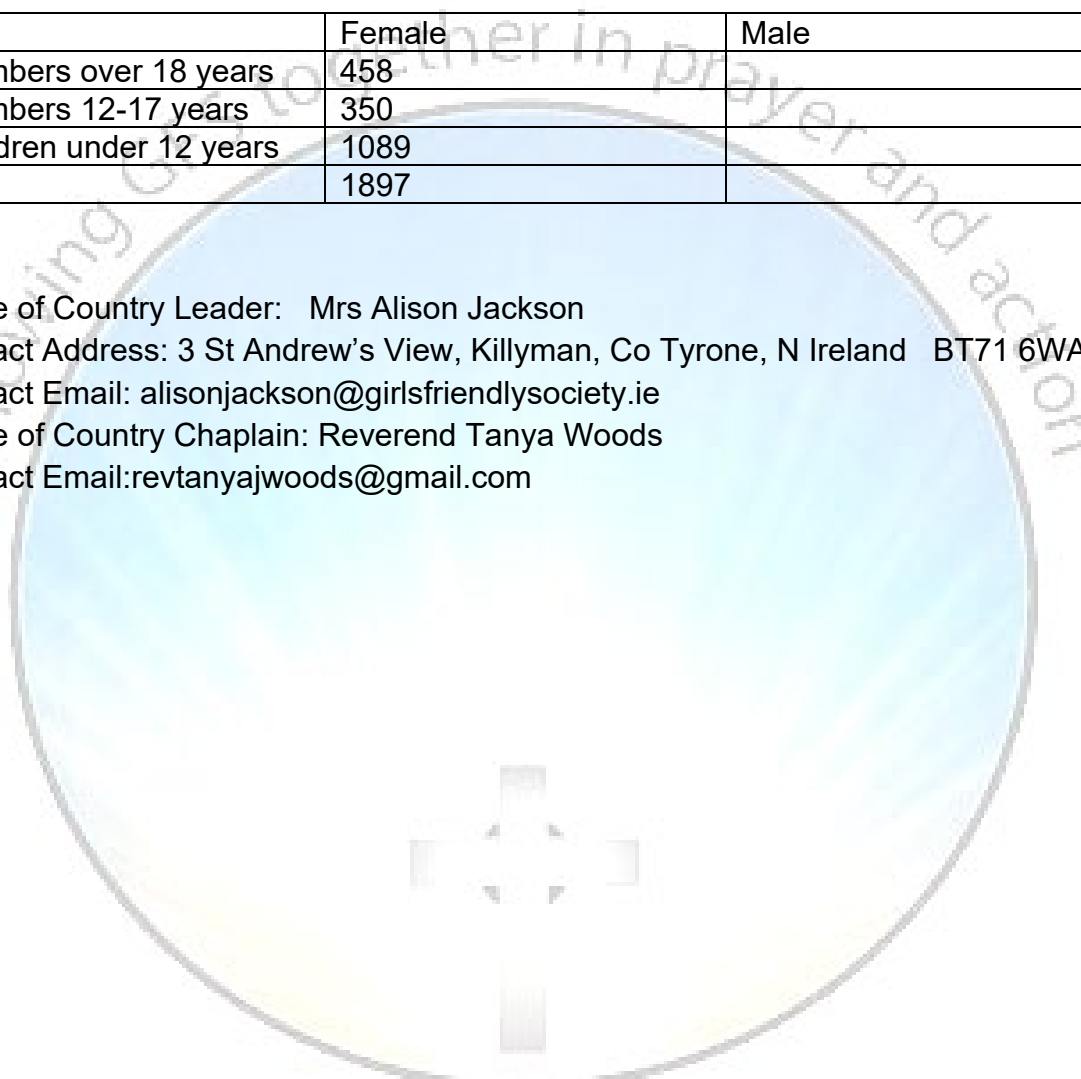

GIRLS' FRIENDLY SOCIETY - IRELAND

Greetings to our GFS family world-wide from GFS Ireland

Major highlights and joys:

- We had great joy in welcoming Mrs Thembeke Pama as she visited Ireland in May 2018 and addressed the Church of Ireland General Synod. This helped raised the profile of GFS within the wider church.
- The transition of our Central GFS presidency from Mrs Sylvia Quinn to Mrs Alison Jackson along with the other central office holders.
- Registration of GFS as a charity with Charities Regulator in Ireland
- GFS in Ireland completed many years of support for their GFS mission partners working in Kiwoko Hospital, Uganda and are now supporting the Urban Development Programme in Nairobi, Kenya.
- GFS was asked to participate in the celebration of Mrs Cecil Frances Alexander, the famous children's hymnwriter (All things bright and beautiful) and who was central to the development and establishment of GFS in Ireland.

Delivery on 3 areas of focus from 2017-2020 term

1. Orange day

GFS in Ireland continues to support the Orange Day on the 25th of each month, the purpose of the day was covered at a central level and also at the various Leader training days.

2. Care of Creation to curb Climate Change

GFS in Ireland have always encouraged its' membership to 'reduce, recycle, reuse, up-style' within our craft work. Specifically, we have used the 'Less Plastic for Lent' initiative circulated by GFS worldwide and each branch has been encouraged to use this programme within their parishes, schools and communities.

3. Spiritual Growth

GFS Ireland continues to develop and implement its Bible Study programme with a specific focus on giving our members and leaders the skills and knowledge to help them develop and grow in their faith. An increasing number of our members come from either no faith background or a very limited church background and we therefore see this aspect of our work as important now, as when GFS was founded.

4. Development of members and Organisation

GFS in Ireland operates within 2 jurisdictions, - Northern Ireland which is part of the United Kingdom and in the Republic of Ireland. While this can bring challenges to reporting in each of the jurisdictions, our ongoing strength is the unity of purpose for our leaders and members throughout the island of Ireland. We find that GFS faces many challenges as many leaders and helpers find life becoming ever busier and it is difficult for them to commit the time, skills and effort to operate, promote and develop GFS. Family life has changed for families, given both parents often work outside of the home and have long commutes and therefore are not home in time to bring their daughters to GFS etc. That said, we have an amazing group of girls (GFS

in Ireland membership begins from 3 years old) for whom it is our privilege to work with. Many branches continue to be an important witness in their local communities. We continue to develop the programmes offered to our leaders and senior members, through regional and Diocesan training days.

The members continue to challenge and upskill themselves through our annual craft programmes.

Friendships are created and developed through our bi-annual All Ireland camps.

5. Celebrations

GFS in Ireland celebrated its 140th anniversary in 2017. This was a wonderful year to celebrate the work and witness of GFS and look forward in faith and expectation to the future.

GFS had the honour of being invited to a Garden party hosted by the Irish President, Michael D Higgins at his official residence in Ireland.

6. New branch establishment

GFS continues to support Dioceses as they help local churches and communities develop their GFS ministry. We have seen a number of branches re-open after a break and the opening of other branches which is encouraging.

Major challenges

- To remain relevant to our membership in the 21st Century
- To help our members protect their mental health and well-being within a Christian context.
- Implementing the current Covid 19 regulations to facilitate our members, leaders and helpers meet while observing the advices from our respective Health Promotion Agencies.

We are mindful that GFS has already continued to operate through earlier world wide pandemics, develop best practice and guidelines given the age range of our membership (3 years old and over)

- Developing and adapting where possible our programmes to reflect changes within society where families are often 'blended' and it can be difficult for parents to commit given work and commuting constraints.
- To foster a sense of cohesion and sense of purpose for membership when they are not able to meet in person. Many branches operate in areas where the internet provision is poor. Where is it possible to 'connect' to ensure that on line safety is a core skill we can help our members develop and be aware of.
- GFS in Ireland has always operated within 2 jurisdictions – Northern Ireland and Republic of Ireland but both were within the European Union and many of the governmental youth policy requirements were broadly similar. From 2021, Northern Ireland as part of the United Kingdom will be outside of the European Union and there is no clarity as to government policies may change and differ for us.

Major plans for next three years:

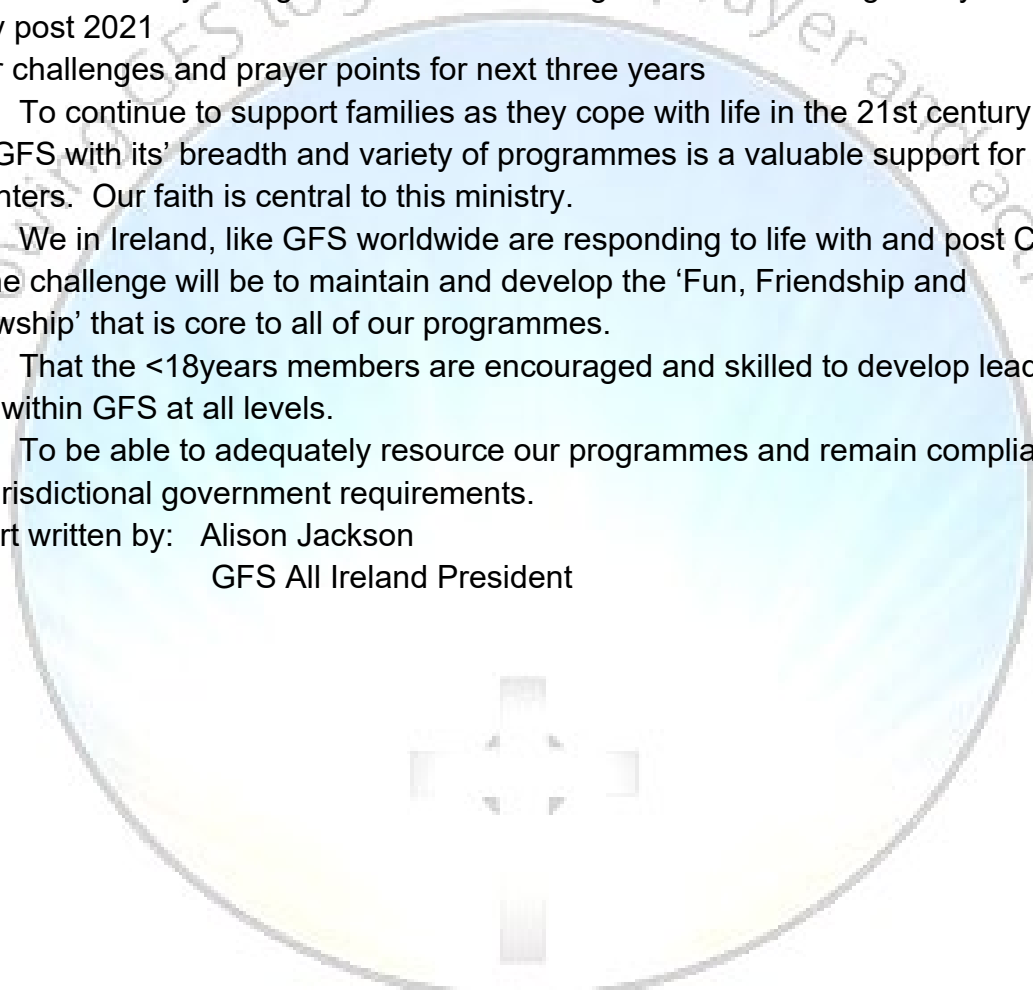
- Delivery and implementation of our web site as an interactive training and resource hub for our membership, church and local communities
- Develop our programmes to help and support our membership with their mental health and well-being
- Develop further multiagency approaches to our programmes, we are currently working with the Church of Ireland's youth department, Tear Fund and GFS as we develop our Social Justice Badge programme for our members.
- Address any changes that flow from the governmental changes to youth policy post 2021

Major challenges and prayer points for next three years

- To continue to support families as they cope with life in the 21st century and how GFS with its' breadth and variety of programmes is a valuable support for their daughters. Our faith is central to this ministry.
- We in Ireland, like GFS worldwide are responding to life with and post Covid 19, the challenge will be to maintain and develop the 'Fun, Friendship and Fellowship' that is core to all of our programmes.
- That the <18years members are encouraged and skilled to develop leadership roles within GFS at all levels.
- To be able to adequately resource our programmes and remain compliant to the jurisdictional government requirements.

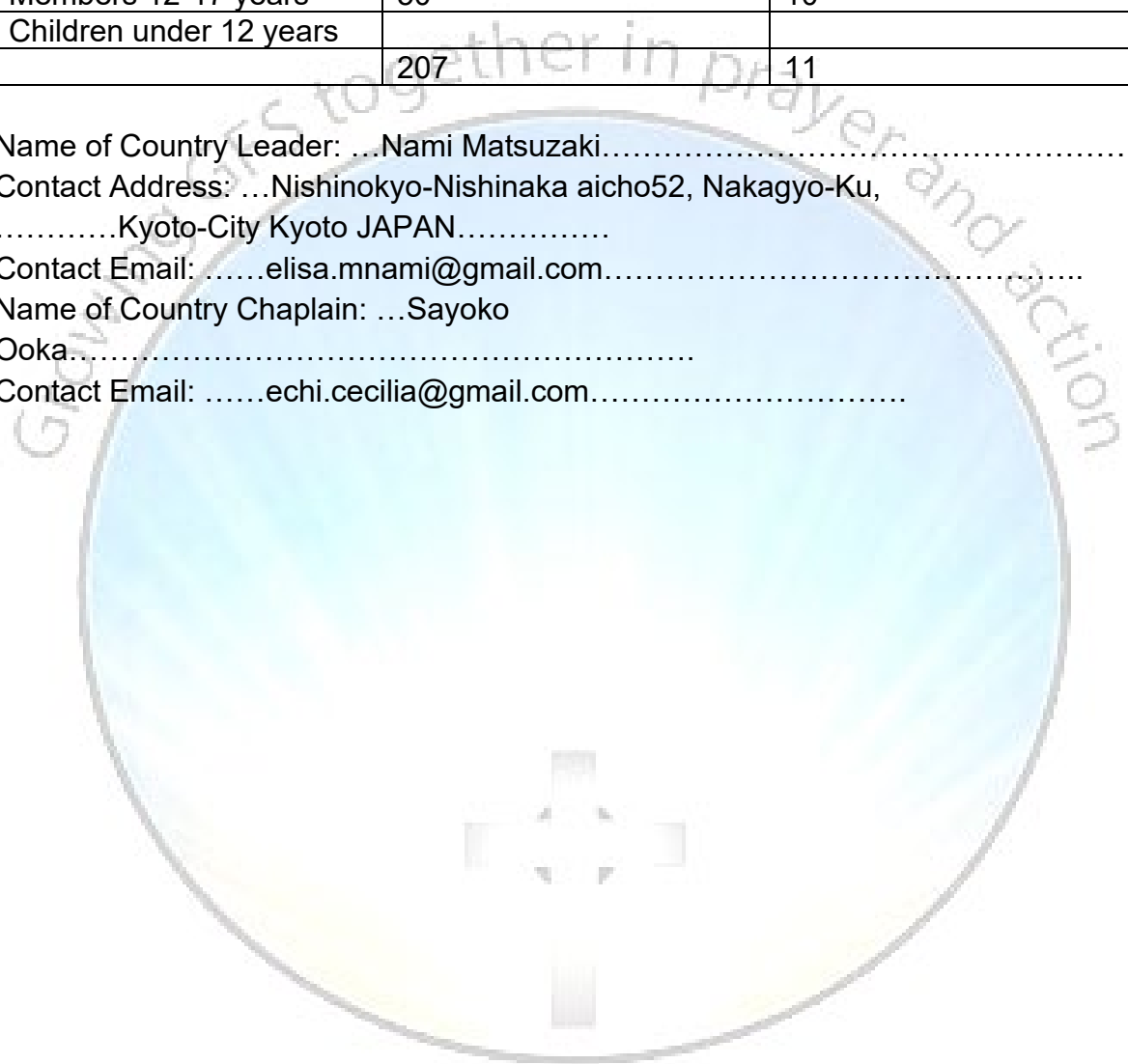

GFS JAPAN

Major highlights and joys:

1. Orange Day:

Although GFS Japan by itself has not done anything particularly about Orange Day, we are widely sending our message that we are against abuse of women with other women's group of Nippon Seiko Kai (the Anglican Church in Japan). On 1st Dec. 2019 we got together to have a worship service at St. Andrew's Cathedral in Tokyo. We prayed to stop the violence against women.

2. Care of creation to curb climate change:

We know how important to care of creation to curb the climate change. So, we make a lot of efforts in daily life, for instance we sort out the garbage, recycle them and not to use plastic bags and when we travel domestically, we choose getting on the car or train rather than airplane.

3. Spiritual Growth:

Every year GFS Japan get together to study and work for our spiritual growth.

*In August 2017 we studied about Ainu (indigenous people) in Hokkaido. We learned they had lived there peacefully for a long time, but after new settlers came there from main island of Japan, they lost their land and their culture was jeopardized.

*In July 2018 we studied about Christian persecution in Edo period (about from the 17th to mid of 19th century) in Tokyo. While they were forbidden to be Christian, they did not abandon to believe in Christ although they had to hide their belief in many ways.

*In October 2019 we studied about the discrimination of lepers and of so-called 'buraku' people in Kagoshima. They are still under prejudice and invisible discrimination because they have leprosy or because their ancestors were forced to live in the designated area and to do particular jobs.

4. Development of members and organization :

We had a national meeting at Kyoto in February 2019. Nami Matsuzaki was elected as the president of GFS Japan. Because the members are becoming older and the numbers of the leaders decreased, they cannot operate by one local GFS. So, Kyoto, Osaka and Kobe GFS began to operate the center office together.

5. Celebrations

We published the 100th anniversary magazine in 2018. They have worked for 10 years to issue it. It will be the valuable historical material for GFS Japan.

6. New branch establishment

It seems that Chubu GFS which was very active historically but recently down has a sign of reuniting again. We hope they will be back, and it will be our joy.

Major Challenges:

We have continued to work for the children suffering from the damage of the Great East Japan Earthquake 2011.

*In August 2017 we helped the refreshing camp for the children in Ishinomaki.

*From 2017 to 2020 we have helped the NPO named "Foster Infant Children and Adolescents" which has worked for the health of the children in Fukushima. They worked for thyroid examination which could be influenced by the 2011 nuclear accident to the children who lived in the nursing home in Fukushima.

*In May 2018 we went to Fukushima to see how they live in Fukushima after the accident. After the accident they moved from Fukushima because they were afraid of the effects of radiation. A few people came back to their hometown.

Major plans for next three years:

Since the Great East Japan Earthquake happened, 9 years have passed. Still now we are working and will continue to work especially for the children's health in Fukushima. We are grateful to GFS World for your big support.

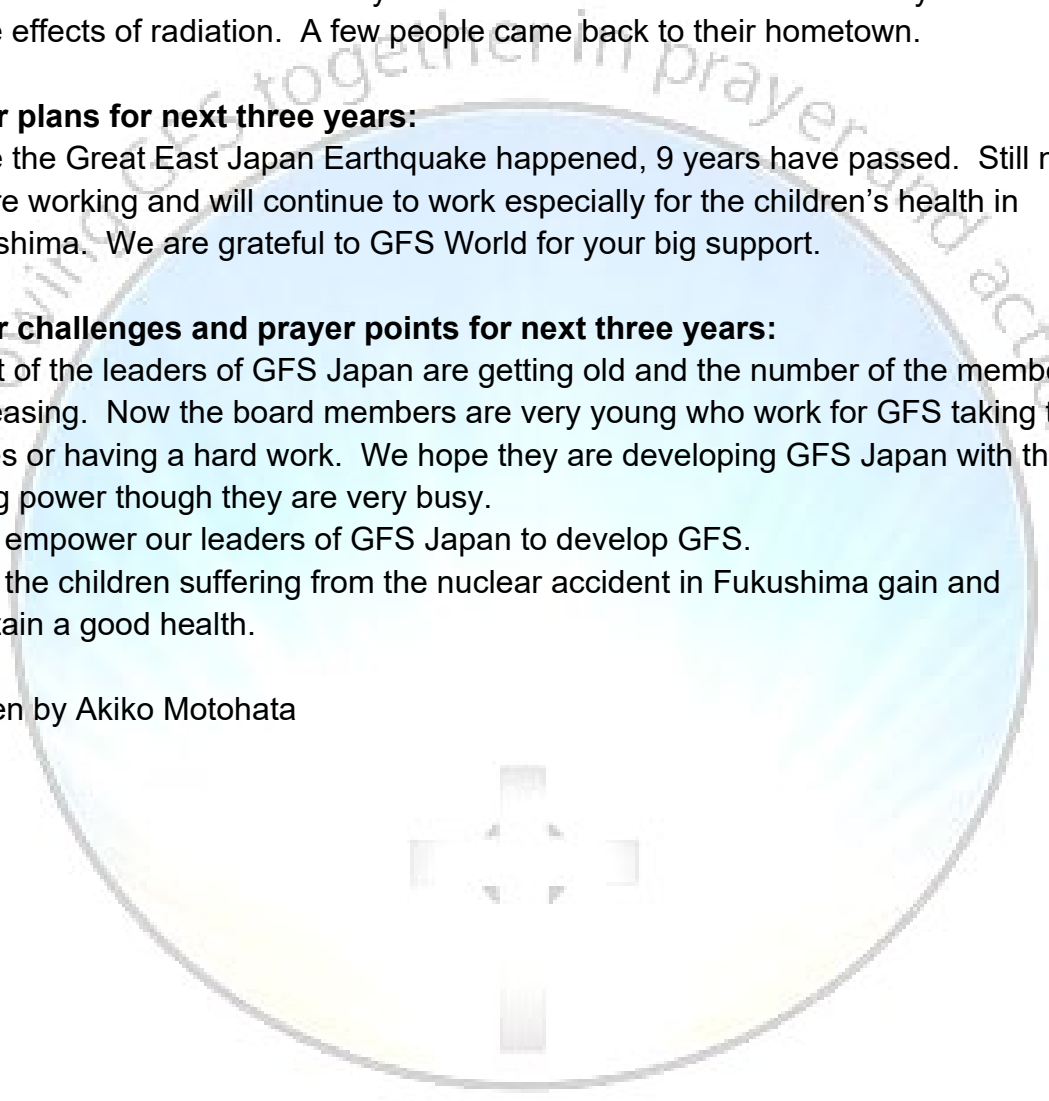
Major challenges and prayer points for next three years:

KOREA

Major highlights and joys:

•U- Mul-Ga Project

The U-Mul-Ga project started as World Project in 2008 with aims of building self-support for the female North Korean defectors. U-Mul-Ga foundation opened Café Grace in two branches: Seoul Anglican Cathedral of Sts.Mary and Nicolas and Dongseo oriental traditional Hospital, opened March of 2008 and November 16th, 2015 respectively. Café Grace hires full time workers of North Korean defectors, providing experience and support needed for self-sufficiency, while providing a healthy community through events such as picnics and volunteer works. Also, U-Mul-Ga is continuing with ongoing projects such as Pro bono – providing free legal advice for North Korean female defectors; Scholarship Programmes – supporting children of North Korean Defectors; Fund raising – through annual bazaar. U-Mul-Ga as enjoys occasional special events such as “Barista Archbishop Rt.Rev Paul Kim” on Christmas eve of 2016 and sponsoring other Anglican communities in Korea.

3.Raising awareness of the statistics and realities of North Korean Defectors, especially women. On September 26th 2019, GFS members gathered for a documentary-movie showing of “Why I Left Both Koreas (2017) director: Choi, Joong-ho”, dealing with the realities of North Korean defectors followed with an honest discussion with the director. On Feb 12th this year, seminar titled “North Korean Refugees, our neighbour” was held with special lecture from Prof. Hwa-soon Kim from Hansin university.

•Orange Day and Women’s’ Missionary Centre

1.On November 25th, 2019, we celebrated Day-1 with a workshop on “Gender Equal Anglican Church” with special lecturer Sun-hee, Yang from Seoul YWCA.

2.From the Day-1, we continued with 14 days of Prayer following up to World Human Rights Day on December 10th.

3.Anglican Women’s’ Society of Korea (including GFS and MU) elected Yoosun, Seok (formal president of GFS Seoul Diocese) as president – and will be focusing on increasing cooperation for Gender Equality and for the roles and spirituality as Christians.

4.In 2019, Anglican Women’s Society held forum with 61 members on June 6th titled: “Towards 130 years of Church Community: The Future of education and spirituality in women in their 50s and 60s.”

5.In 2020, Anglican Women’s Society will hold a forum and discuss “Safe Church Environment” and creating Safety Guard to prevent sexual assault and provide safety net as recommended by ACC.

•Organizational Changes in GFS Korea

1.New Branch Establishment – Onsuri Church, September 2nd, 2019 and 9 new members joined GFS Korea. Formal GFS Korea president Cha, Sun-ok Agatha was

essential in the process, and Bae Young Hee Maria will be representing GFS Onsuri Church branch at the World Council 2020.

2. We are welcoming our new chaplain of GFS Korea, Rev Esther Bbun-ea Lee (Wonju Church in Daejeon Diocese), as Rev Kiri Kim has been appointed to New York Trinity church, USA.

• Celebrations

1. 2021 is the year we celebrate the 130th Anniversary of Anglican Church of Korea. GFS is also in preparation to celebrate the joyous event.

2. We have celebrated 5th Anniversary of Womens' Mission Centre with a Music Concert at Seoul Cathedral (2019.10.10 19:00), inviting artists and choirs of the church and the community.

Major challenges:

- Hardships in Member Growth
 - No increase in youth participation, while the elders are no longer taking acting roles in GFS.
 - In other churches, Korean Anglican church have a unique custom, categorizing women by age and encouraging to move from GFS to Mothers' Union at around the age of 55. Also, this is promoted by lack of understanding in the community and the clergy.
 - Highly competitive society – people just do not have time to engage in church communities. Adolescents are busy studying for higher education; and then young adults are under pressure of job securities.
- Defining the Role of GFS in Korean Anglican Community
- Increased work burden leads to less participation, and it's a vicious cycle!

Major plans for next three years:

- Connecting to world GFS and other international Anglican Organizations
- Increasing Participation and awareness of GFS members in Policies towards Gender. Also, increasing participation in Anglican Womens' Society of Korea.
- Hopefully, increasing GFS members and branches! Including active junior and senior members.

Major challenges and prayer points for next three years:

- Pray that our plans may be fit to God's will.
- Pray that our major goals for next three years will bring positive outcomes
- Pray for health and growth in spirituality of each and every member of GFS, so that we will trust God ask for guidance
- Pray for Peace in Korean Peninsula and the world

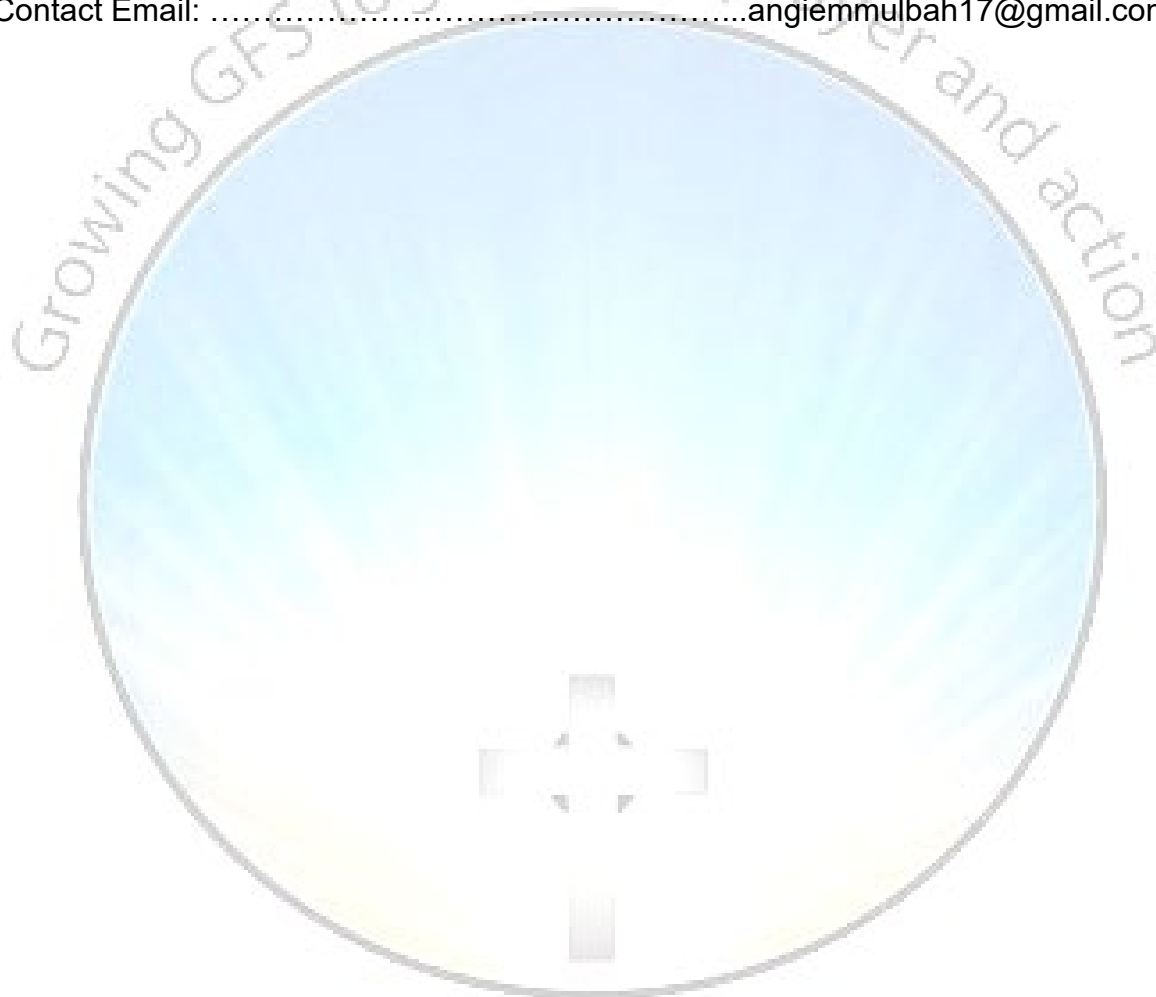

I am pleased to submit our stewardship for the period stated above. It was a pleasure leading the team to where we are.

Major highlights and joys:

- Increment in membership by 42.9% (2004-2008=426, 2009-2016=742, 2017-2020 Feb. 1,060) The increment emanated from several activities that were carried out that aroused interest of our members some of which are as follows: debate, spelling bee competition, Bible quizzing, praise dance, lecture Series, display of talent, Parade, travelling to other counties, GFS branches and other places. The visitation resulted into Admission services.
- Held our annual convention that elected and installed new corps of Diocesan Officers
- There was enormous enthusiasm of the girls, young women and Sponsors/Advisers in the mission and activities of the GFS. This enable us to explore new avenue and ideas.
- Continuous observance of the World Day of Prayer
- Participation in Diocesan programs of the Episcopal Church of Liberia especially having the girls serve as pages at our Church's Diocesan Convention
- Creating the awareness of the importance of the existence and functioning of GFS in Liberia, thereby, generating some funding and moral contributions from our Diocese, Sponsors / Advisers and some of our parents.
- Amended our (GFS-Liberia) Constitution
- We celebrated 65 year of existence in August of 2018 in grand style under the theme "GFS @ 65 Be the light for all to see."
- Visitation from a member of the Mother's Union in Guinea to our 65 year of existence with the hope that she would go back and help establish the GFS organization in her country. Thanks to our Archbishop, Jonathan B.B. Hart and the Bishop of Guinea who coordinated the process of the visit of Sister Sara Abeioseh.
- GFS Liberia attended the 2nd African Council Conference held in Kigali. A total of 10 individuals were in attendance and the delegation consisted of the President, Vice president, Chaplin one coordinator, one sponsor, and 5 girls from various Parishes and congregations both within and outside the capital city.
- Re-awakening of 2 dormant branches
- Weekly activities of the girls including handiwork and Bible study among others
- Two of our active young women got married and we were in full attendance at their weddings. Several of them graduated from grade school and Universities.
- On a sad note, we buried our past Diocesan President, Esther H. Page, a Sponsor, Elain T. Dunn and one of our girls (Crystal Dennis). Peace be to their ashes. We appreciated tribute sent on behalf of World Council through our world President, Thembeke Pama.

• We highly appreciate the budgetary allotment given the GFS-Liberia by our Diocese last year (2019). It enabled us to meet some of the needs of our programs.

Major challenges

- Not sufficient financial support
- Furnishing of our Office space to store our documents, to host meetings and carry on counselling
- Getting volunteers to teach the girls and young women
- Not much is done to create awareness in the entire country because of the lack of finance
- The establishment of Boys' Friendly Society (BFS). At our Church's Diocesan Convention this year, the idea was met with stiff resistance from the youths especially the male component

• We could not attend World Council in 2017 due to visa problem

Major plans and prayer points for next three years:

- To develop a more committed and passionate leadership from branch to Diocesan levels
- To conduct an Annual Diocesan vacation enrichment program for the young women
- Work towards the sustainability of the local and Diocesan Organization through the implementation of major fund raising activities and engaging in income generation activities
- To have committed volunteers to work with the girls and young women
- Have a Diocesan debate team with focus on increasing the girls public speaking and self-realization
- Creating awareness at the Diocesan level

Strengthening the existing branches and establishing 4 new ones

- Adding to our uniform style but maintaining the navy blue and white colours
- To create more unity and bond between and among our members and the world-wide GFS
- Improve the activities of the young women by organizing a spirit-filled Praise and worship Dance Team at various branch level that will eventually result into forming a Diocesan Dance Team as it has started to add flavour to our worship
- The effective wearing of Orange on the 25th of every month and the effective implementation of the Echo project
- That the Diocese continue to provide support to the GFS
- That dialogue towards the establishment of the Boy's Friendly Society (BFS) begins next year

New Zealand

Format for report:

Major highlights and joys:

- Our GFS Council (led by Helen Allen, NZ President) has 10 members, all women who bring a range of skills to GFS. Our focus is still providing Scholarships to young women who for several reasons would not be able to attend a tertiary Institution without the help of a GFS Scholarship. We have also supported young women in their final years at school to attend leadership courses held at Outward Bound an outdoor education facility. The Outward Bound facility teaches leadership skills as well as boosting confidence and working as a team.
- We welcomed new Committee member Christine Mutch, during 2019. Christine is a secondary school teacher and has a range of skills including mentoring. It is hoped that, if needed, she will be able to mentor our young girls in transitioning from school to a Tertiary Institution.
- For the three years up until the end of 2019 we successfully supported sixteen young women with their tertiary education. Our support involves funding for three years of tertiary study at an approved University or similar institution and regular one on one contact with the student throughout each year. Some of our young women have maintained contact long after they have completed their University studies.
- We supported eight young women at Outward Bound Courses teaching leadership skills, self-confidence and working within a team environment. The girls who attend these courses are chosen by their schools and GFS Council meet the girls once the course is completed. GFS continue to receive regular while the girls are at school.

Major challenges

- Looking ahead our major challenges include maintaining and fostering current and new relationships with the schools and tertiary institutions within our local area.

Major plans for next three years:

- There are a number of Scholarships available in the wider community and during the past two years GFS NZ have increased the value of current and new scholarships and it is hoped that we will be able to increase these further over the next three years. GFS NZ are always on the lookout for opportunities to fund young women.

Report to 31.12.19**

STATISTICS:

GFS operates in two dioceses in PNG – Port Moresby and Popondota. At this stage there is no provincial constitution or structure. Mary Bagu from Popondota diocese was appointment by GFS Australia in discussion with the Archbishop of PNG, as Provincial Coordinator for two years and her contract was completed on 31.12.19. There are no plans to appoint a new coordinator at this time. The major challenge for such an appointment is the cost of travel for a Coordinator to visit other dioceses and no funds available within GFS in PNG.

Major highlights and joys:

GFS Australia continue to support GFS in PNG with annual visits to both dioceses. The training team of Canon Val Gribble, The Revd Canon Cheryl Selvage and The Revd Sue Wilson provide workshops, usually visit at the time of World Day of Prayer, and train Children’s Ministry workers to use the PNG World Project sponsored Sunday School program. These visits are highly valued both by GFS and by the Anglican church in both dioceses.

- Girika Sanata from Port Moresby represented PNG at the World Council in Perth, Australia. Because of World Council there was no visit by Australian leaders in 2017.
- A new executive was elected in Popondota in 2017 with Vivian Jirega taking over the Presidency from Mary Bagu. Vivian began a concentrated visit to remote parishes to introduce GFS (all by foot walking) This has resulted in a large increase in members. GFS Australia has worked with executive members and parish leaders to identify the many

challenges and how to look to future. MU and GFS work well together in Popondota diocese and often do promotion walks to villages together.

Both groups visited the local jail, together, for worship and fellowship

- Port Moresby introduced Orange day. Held a Walkathon with GFS feeding volunteers and GFS members escorted by Police with theme “Zero Down Hunger and Thirst, Zero Down Poverty and Giver hope to the Hopeless”. Encouraged the use of Bilum (cultural string bag) in place of plastic bags.

GFS Australia provided four sewing machines and classes were introduced. Provided workshops on CV preparation and training on self esteem and goal setting.

2018 – 33 Commissioned members with an Executive and Girika Sanata as Diocesan Coordinator of GFS.

Establishment of GFS Feeding Ministry which has attracted a number of male volunteers who have become members.

Girika Sanata visited Popondota diocese with the Australian team in 2019 to encourage working together.

Major challenges

- POPONDOTA – Few members pay fees and therefore the financial situation, including maintenance on GFS Haus is in a bad situation.
- The remoteness of parishes (and their branches) and the cost of bus travel is a constant challenge to gather members together. The President’s health has been affected by the long walks (often over days) to visit branches.
Lack of training facilities or resources for branches.
Financial situation of Anglican Diocese of Popondota affects all organisations in the diocese.
Maintaining GFS Haus which is now 16 years old and needs much maintenance.

PORT MORESBY

Unsafe for girls to move around freely, therefore need to encourage male members.

GFS program roll out to parishes not effective due to differences (Anglican church/MU/other denominations).

High venue fees charged is a hindrance to rolling out its programs in the city and the community.

Upskilling of executive in terms of technology and office administration.

Majority of members are unemployed

Major plans for next three years:

POPONDOTA

- Encourage the payment of fees by all members
- Attempt to maintain GFS Haus.
- Continue to promote GFS in other parishes
- Attempt to foster a willingness of team work amongst executive members.

PORT MORESBY

- Establish a GFS office and a conference facility
- Encourage more life skill training for its unemployed members for job opportunities
- Sewing project to be an income generating business to support its programs.

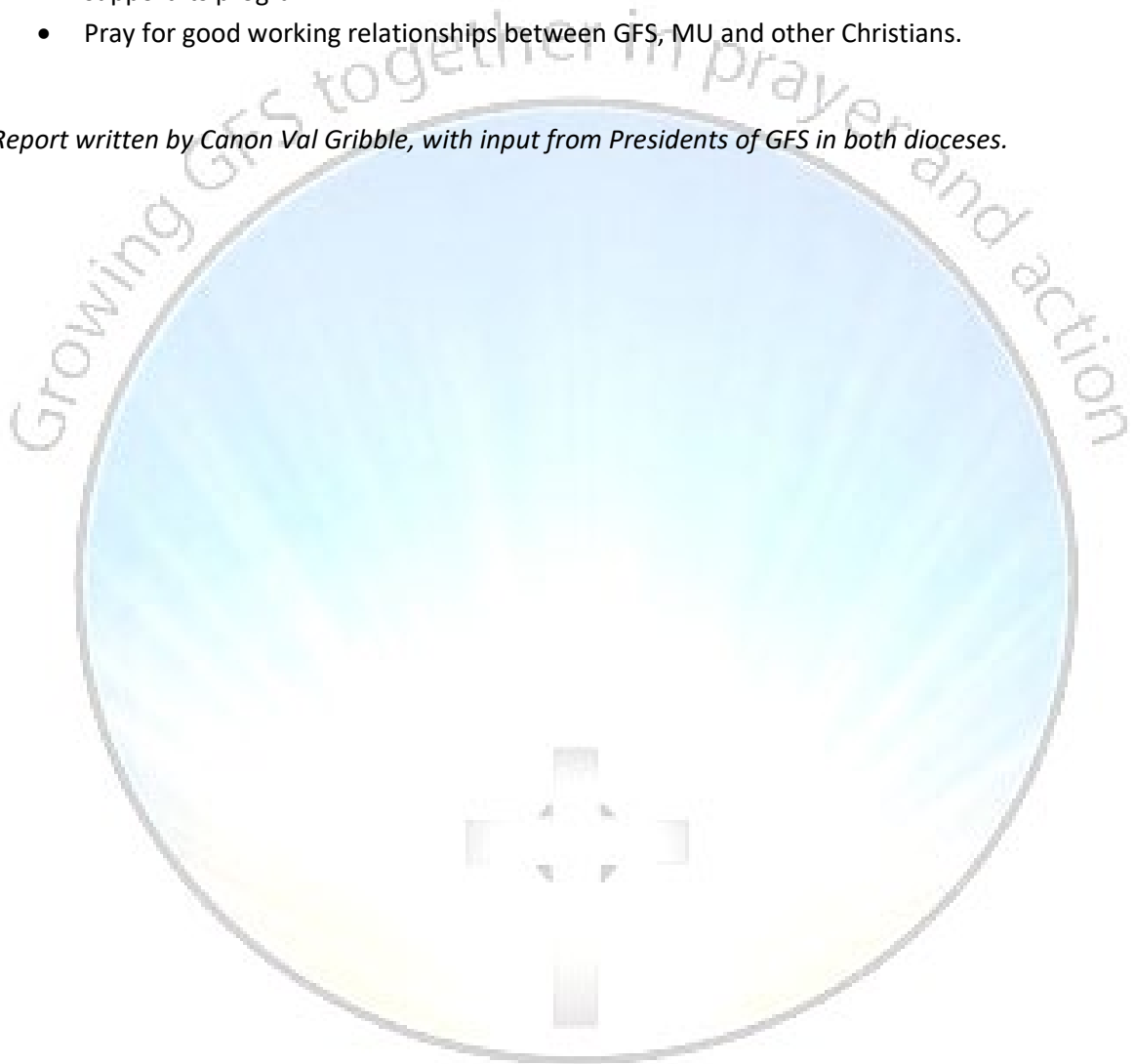
- Provide awareness programs of GFS to parishes and communities including schools.

Major highlights and joys:

- GFS Rwanda attended the World Council meeting in Australia 2017 for the first time represented by the then Chaplain Rev. Winnie MUVUNYI
- GFS Rwanda visited Mombasa Diocese in March 2018 on the invitation of GFS Mombasa who had offered to support us in the organization of the GFS African Conference
- GFS Rwanda hosted a historical event **GFS African conference** from 6th to 9th December 2018 hosting 12 countries. In this conference, the GFS world president together with the Bishop of Kigali Diocese commissioned a new Gfs Rwandan National President Ruth Mukabaranga and two Diocesan presidents: Diana Uwera –Kigali Diocese and Jean D` Arc Mukarugwiro Byumba Diocese.
- Have been organising annual conferences during long vacations
- GFS Leadership has visited several branches and had fellowship with girls and Parish leadership as well as MU who are their mentors
- We visited Byumba Diocese during the inauguration of 40 new GFS members

- Kigali Diocese specifically St. Etienne cathedral, started over night prayers for GFS every Friday of the month led by GFS leadership of the Diocese. This is in line with our Worldwide theme of **“Growing together in Prayer and Action”**. They learnt more about GFS, its goals and objectives; later on they came up with an annual action plan and carried out some economic programs like cooking.
- The Action Plan included days of fellowship of outreach where they have visited Hospitals and orphanages, visiting survivors of the genocide – working with widows and mothers who survived as well as children born as a result of the massive rapes, donating what they have so as to bear one another’s burden and fulfil the law of Christ
- Regarding economic activities, GFS in Byumba Diocese, have been engaged in crafts, canteen and livestock
- GFS Kigali Diocese, had been lent a garden that was used for rent to private events like weddings, and other types of meetings. However, this is no longer functioning due to COVID 19 and will no longer in in the hands of GFS.
- Rwanda was nominated to prepare the format for the International day of prayer to guide gfs worldwide on the celebration of St. Michael and all angles for 2019.
- GFS conducted an outreach fellowship with one of the university in Kigali. **The theme** was “A Christian girl in today’s world “Verse: Proverbs 31:25,30

Major challenges

While we thank God for all the achievements during these 3 years (2017-2019), there is a number of huddles that we are still facing as put forward;

- There is lack of commitment of members. Awareness is minimal.
- GFS is still in 2 Diocese out of 11. This is a very big challenge
- Financial constraint. GFS is still operating under the support of MU and it is therefore quite hard to reach out in a streamlined and well-structured manner.
- Kigali Diocese as the pilot Diocese that started GFS in Rwanda, still hosts the National office which does not have the capacity to carry out its roles as commissioned. The responsibility of reaching out in other Diocese still lies under the host Diocese.

- Economically, GFS is lacking sustainable income generating activities to enable smooth functioning.

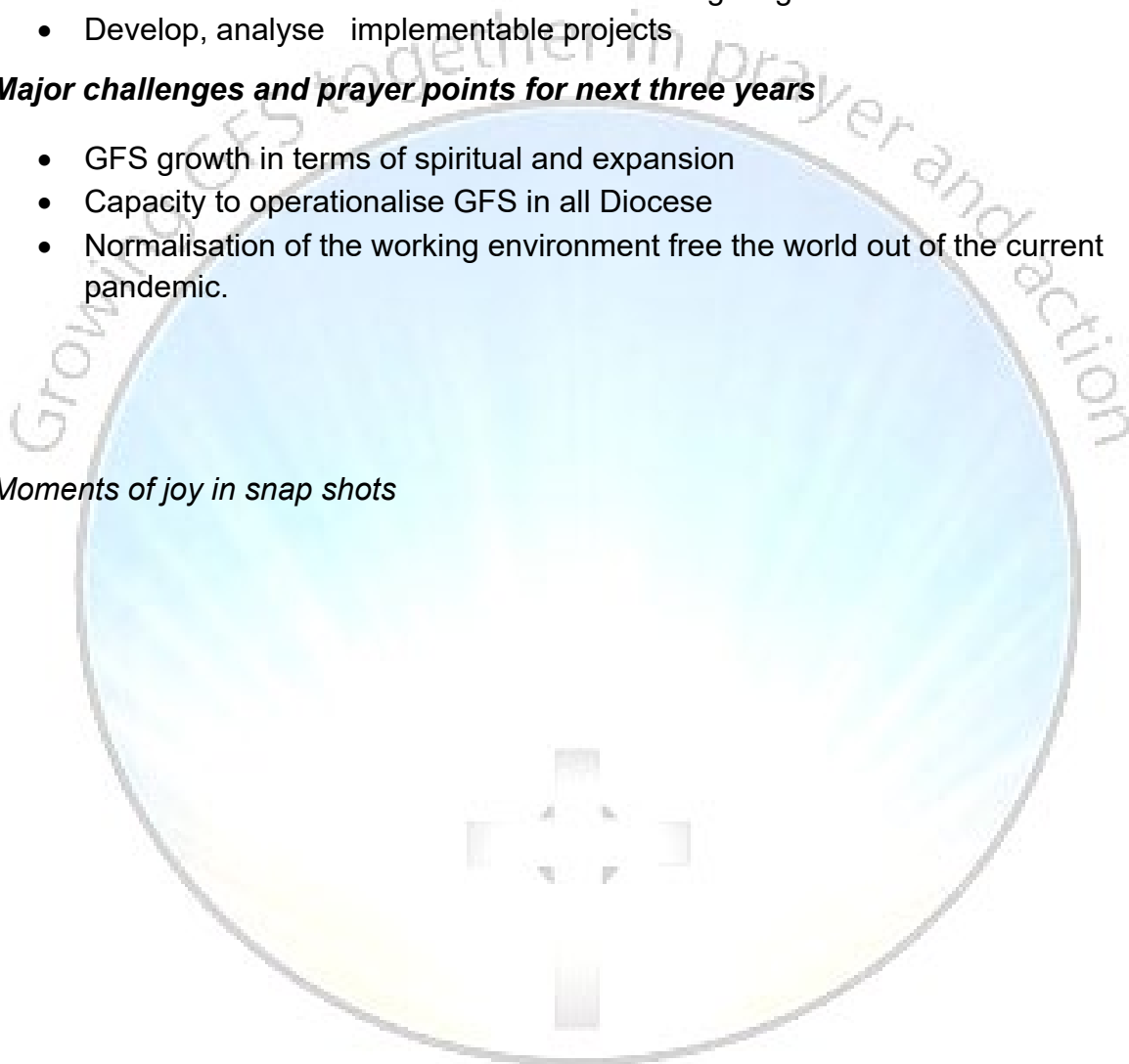

During this term many of GFS members have been ordained, others got married, others graduated in different disciplines.

During lockdown, Computer use, and technology skills improved for the young and old.

Outreach program delivered and reached out to the poor and all those affected and infected by Covid 19

Formed prayer groups that involved all dioceses where gfs exist.

Major challenges

- High prevalence in cases of substance abuse, teenage pregnancy and school dropouts in some Dioceses among members, especially in urban areas.

- Unemployment has a negative impact towards youth of South Africa.
- GFS members tend to outgrow the guild when they reach tertiary education.
- Lack of support from the clergy in many Dioceses discourages both GFS leadership and membership.
- During this covid 19 period, about 17 leaders including 2 chaplains and one Diocesan GFS President succumbed to COVID 19 related illnesses.
- Funds are exhausted since gatherings like diocesan, national and provincial conferences are prohibited.
- We have stopped advocacies on GBV, awareness on substance abuse and teenage pregnancy.
- There are no more retreats, no more physical fundraising activities, no more youth games due to covid 19 regulations, although we have accepted the situation since it is for our safety's sake, members are demotivated.

Major plans for next three years:

We plan and pray to

- Focus more on spiritual growth of both members and leaders.
- Revive GBFS in the Dioceses where it exists.
- Establish it where it is not available.
- Enhance strategies of fundraising, skills development., life skills programmes and career guidance.
